1st Deaf International Short Course Swimming Championship Results

This events was the first major short course (25m) swim meet in history of deaf swimming. There were 103 (25 women and 28 men) swimmers competing. Congratulations to those swimmers who broke 31 World Short Course Records (16 men and 15 women). We had the youngest and oldest swimmers 11 years of age: Emma Doughty from USA and 55 year old Geoff Scott from AUS.


