
All games in rounds are played on time, 50 minutes + 2 mènes. Semi-finales and finales are played till 13 without time limits

<u>Agenda 6</u> Regulations:

- Coaching: Each team will be assisted by a coach taking place aside the playfield next to the scoreboard.
 - Basic the rules of the International Federation (FIPJP).
 - Doubles Singles : Men 8 teams :

Men are playing in 2 pools of 4 teams:

The winners of the pools are dropped into A category, the losers into the B category each playing semi -finals and finals.

• Doubles - Singles : Women 6 teams :

Due to the fact that we do not have eight teams, this competition will be played in 5 rounds.

Ranking will be done by the following order: • number of matches won • best point balance plus -minus in case of equal number of wins









<u>Agenda 6 bis</u> Regulations continued 2:

- The <u>draw</u> of teams will be done by choosing an envelope with enclosed the play scheme during the Technical Meeting (Saturday).
- <u>Singles Men</u> 8 players: 2 pools of 4 teams playing each 3 rounds. The
 winners of the pools are dropped into A -category, the losers into the B category, each playing semi -finals and finals,
- <u>Singles Women</u> 6 players: Predefined 1 pool with 6 teams playing 5 rounds. Ranking by matches won and plus -min balance in each pool. First 2 best by ranking playing the final.
- <u>Precision shooting:</u> <u>Men</u> 8 players: <u>Women</u>: 6 players
 Games are played to the highest points. In case of a tie, an additional barrage will be played.

<u>Agenda 9</u> Future Deaf European Petanque:

- 1. Conditions for EDSO European Championships: minimum 6 countries to start.
 - a. Target achieved after this organization to demonstrate EDSO with the results of this European Cup. EDSO follows this organization.
 - b. Now no Triplets to allow more countries to participate with minimum cost.

 More competitions may be enabled in the future (Triplets, mixed). That means that to do all the matches that is also official with the FIPJ officially there can be played for that on 1 week or several days.
- 2. Best that this European Cup has a sequel: who wants to organize it in 2024 or later? *Spain wants to host the next event, best in 2025.*
 - For a European Championship will have to wait until after the 2024 EDSO Congress in Poland when petanque can be officially included as a new sport for a European Championship.
 - Important now is that all participating countries of this European Cup propose petanque as a new sport before the next Congress 2024 (Poland). In 2022, Padel, Triathlon and Golf were accepted as new sports to be considered for a European Championship.
 - In time, countries will have to look out for a good Sports Director for this sport at EDSO.
- 3. Include petanque in your national sports federations. Other countries also playing petanque with the deaf: Italy, Croatia, Norway, Denmark.....

 It is clear that more than 10 countries can participate here.

 It is also important that this sport be registered in your federation. In most participating countries this is already the case, only in Switzerland it has not happened yet. Switzerland gave permission to the current players on their responsibility.
- 4. Triplets added to program from 2025 or later?

 See Point 1 b
- 5. ICSD audiogram rules to follow from 2024 with ID number? Since petanque is new as an international sport with the Deaf Sports Federations, not all players have an ID number with ICSD according to audiogram rules. Everyone agrees to follow these rules at the next event.
 - For this European Cup, ICSD rules will be followed regarding wearing hearing aids. There was also discussion what happens when a player becomes concerned. Proposal: Player is then excluded for the match they are playing at the moment, the team plays on with 1 player (+balls) less, in any other case the team loses this game 13-7.
